## FERST READERS OF CARROLL COUNTY UPDATE

In this crazy time with COVID-19, I am happy to share with you that Ferst Readers continues to mail books to our children every month. We are grateful for our processing center and our headquarters organization for their continued efforts to make this work. Locally we are doing all we can to maintain our relationships with the post offices and those who register children for us. Our numbers of children are shrinking a bit as we graduate more children than we are receiving registrations for. We will catch that back up as soon as we can connect with all our contacts.

After many years under the auspices of the Community Foundation of West Georgia, Ferst Readers of Carroll County, Inc., now has its own 501c3 Nonprofit Status. Your contributions and our book program will continue to operate through the Community Foundation of West Georgia. Our funds continue to be banked and invested with them. We are now working on new sources of revenue for our Family Education Conversations Count program and that requires that we have our own nonprofit status. We received a grant from the Georgia Office of Student Achievement in 2018-2019 to begin this program.

Conversations Count was developed by Ferst Readers in partnership with Rollins School. Carroll County is among the first to implement this program and has received excellent reviews! We have all the tools to implement this curriculum, train teachers, and provide all they need to teach it in their own circles of influence. We are working on getting all those tools, the Conversations Count Manual, and the presentation videos translated and available in a Spanish version. That is almost ready too! We also anticipate that this program will help us reach children who are not currently registered in our free book program and help us to get them registered.

We will expand our reach in the Conversations Count program and offer incentives to help parents and caregivers to learn more about the importance of early childhood development and what they can do to help their own children simply by talking with and reading to their children. We are moving ahead with planning to spread our Conversations Count training across Carroll County. Karen Wild and a team of people have trained a large group of teachers and facilitators who have begun to teach this program to young families in their own circles in Carrollton City Schools,




